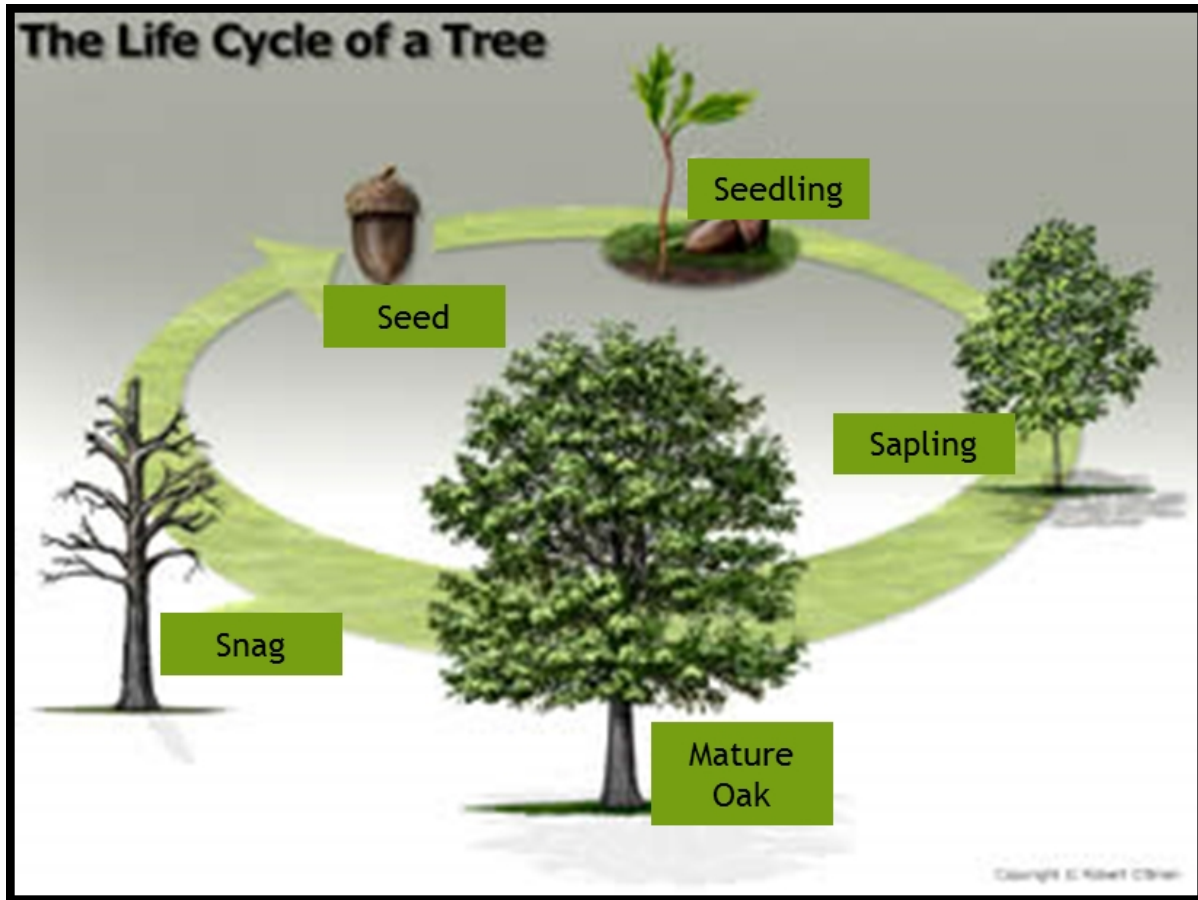

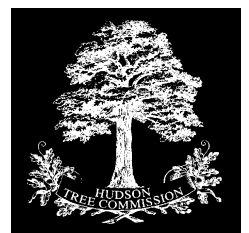
Hudson's urban forest includes more than 14,000 trees in the public right of way, with thousands more in public parks, green spaces and on private property.

A tip for planting an acorn: Perform the float test. Put the acorns you harvested in a bucket of water. Allow the acorns to settle for a minute or two. Discard any acorns that float.
